OCTOBER 01TH

We started slowly from Ollantaytambo Town, a nice little town surrounded by arqueologycal sites and nice people. Taking the car and heading to the famous Abra Malaga Birding site, having some stops on the way for some target birds, then we continue to the highest part of this area to then go over the Abra and getting a variety of forest for different birds.

Birds of the Day:

The Endemics Chesnut Breasted Mountain Finch, White Tufted Sunbeam, Inca Wren, Creamy Crested Spinetail & Cusco Brushfinch.

Some more birds like White browed Conebill, Cinereous Conebill, Scarlet Bellied Mountain Tanager, Red Crested Cotinga, Band Tailed Pigeon, Plumbeous Sierra Finch, Black Backed Grossbeak, Golden Billed Saltator, Amethys Throated Sunangel, Collared Inca, Speckled Hummingbird, Violet Throated Startfronlet, Blue and White

Swallow, White Collared Swift, Rufous Collared Sparrow, Giant Hummingbird, Chiguanco Thrush, Great Thrush, Tiryan Metaltail, Rufous Breasted Chat Tyrant, Green Tailed trainbearer, Andean Goose, Andean Gull, Shining Sunbeam, Creamy Winged Cinclodes, Mountain Caracara.

OCTOBER 02TH

Our second day we decided to look for the special and resticted habitat bird "Royal Cinclodes". So we started early in the morning and went straight to Abra Malaga Pass and walked for more than 04 hours getting our target bird and some more special birds along this tiring but rewarding walk. After this nice morning walk, we just decided to relax a little with a short walk by Peñas, an area with some potato plantation, looking for *Tackzanowsky Tinamou* (Heard).

Birds of the Day:

The Endemics White Browed Tit Spinetail, Rusty Fronted Canastero and the special Royal Cinclodes.

Some other birds like Ash Breasted Tit Tyrant, Tawny Tit Spinetail, Puna Tapaculo, Thick Billed Siskin, Plain Colored Seedeater, Cordilleran Canastero, Paramo Pipit, Andean Swallow, Puna Ground Tyrant, Tackzanowsky Ground Tyrant, Black Necked Stilt, Andean Flicker, Blue Mantled Thornbill, Ash Breasted Sierra Finch, White Winged Cinclodes, Puna Ibis.

OCTOBER 03TH

Our morning was not the best since one of my Guest had some stomache, so we did not bird much. But we managed to get a big target bird right by the Hotel at Ollantaytambo. *Bearded Mountaneer*, Endemic to Peru. We saw it quite close and got some nice shots from this beautiful hummingbird. Then we drove to Cusco to spend the night there and

get ready for the following day. On the way to Cusco we did a short stop to get some water birds by Waypo Lake, getting some new birds for this trip.



Birds of the Day:

■ The Endemic Bearded Mountaineer, Green Tailed Trainberear, White Bellied Hummingbird, Cinnamon Teal, White Tufted Greebe, Yellow Winged Blackbird, Many Colored Rush Tyrant, Wren like Rushbird, Variable Hawk, Lesser Yellowleg, Andean Coot, Yellow Billed Pintail, Yellow Billed Teal, Puna Teal, American Kestrel.

OCTOBER 04TH

We left Cusco after breakfast and headed to Manu Road. On the way we had some stops around Huacarpay Lake for some target birds, then another one by Huancarani Town for some more Target Birds, we were lucky since we got what we wanted. We were also lucky having a sunny day, this way we could enjoy the landscape along the road to finally arrive to Wayqecha Lodge, where we had five days to bird around.

Birds of the Day:

■ The Endemic Creamy Crested Spinetail, Chesnut Breasted Mountain Finch & once again Bearded Mountaineer. Some more cool birds like Streak Fronted Thornbird, Black Tailed Trainbearer, Black Throated Flowerpiercer, Moustached Flowerpiercer, Sierran Elaenia, House Wren, Rufous Naped Ground Tyrant, Rufous Webbed Bush Tyrant, Amethys Throated Sunangel, Chiguanco Thrush, Great Thrush, Bare Faced Ground Dove, Blue and Yellow Tanager, Rufous Collared Sparrow, Hooded Siskin, Band Tailed Seedeater, Peruvian Sierra Finch, Plumbeous Rail & Golden Billed Saltator.

OCTOBER 05TH

Another beautiful day with very cool birds at Wayqecha Station, we had a pleasent weather with a little sunshine. We started in the morning with the Canopy Walkway getting some good birds as we walked down to the place. Once there, we could enjoy the *Elfin Forest* from a different angle and we took some nice bird shots from the Canopy Walk Way, then walked back to the main highway for more birding before lunch.

A little break after having lunch since the temperature can also be hot here during midday and started again in the afternoon with another birding walk, this time we went down the road with some nice birding activity.

Birds of the Day:

Slaty Backed Chat Tyrant, White Collared Jay, Golden Collared Tanager, White Collared Swift, Rust and Yellow Tanager, Rufous Chested Tanager, Tyrannine Woodcreeper, Gray Breasted Mountain Toucan, Pale Legged Warbler, Citrine Warbler, White Throated Tyrannulet, White Banded Tyrannulet, Three Striped Warbler, Grass Green Tanager, Hooded Mountain Tanager, Black Throated Tody

Tyrant, Andean Guan, Long Tailed Sylph, Black Faced Brush Finch, White Bellied Woodstart, Slaty Backed Nightingale Thrush, Glossy Black Thrush & Buff Breasted Mountain Tanager.



Birds we Heard: Red and White Antpitta (Endemic), Tawny Breasted Tinamou, Hooded Tinamou, Rufous Antpitta, Scaly Naped Parrot, Rufous Bellied Bush Tyrant & Azara's Spinetail.

OCTOBER 06TH

Today we went back to Acjanacco Pass, where the Manu National Park begins. Driving for 30 minutes to get to this place and do some birding by Paramo & Tree line forest, we got some interesting birds and nice male *Andean Fox* walking by the bushes around the main road. Then we slowly started moving down toward the lodge having some birding stops. Another nice sunny day with many birds, later on and after nice lunch at the lodge we continued moving down the road for more birds and some owling before dinner.

Birds of the Day:

The Endemic Marcapata Spinetail plus the uncommon Chesnut Throated Cotinga. Some more cool birds like Barred Fruiteater, Superciliared Hemispingus, Mountain Wren, Spectacled Redstart, Montane Woodcreeper, Cinnamon Flycatcher, Fawn Breasted Tanager, Puna Thistletail, Brown Backed Chat Tyrant, Scaly Naped Parrot, Aplomado Falcon, Streak Throated Bush Tyrant, Cliff Swallow, Brown Bellied Swallow, Bang Winged Nightjar, Glossy Black Thrush.

Birds we Heard: Yungas Pygmy Owl, Rufous Banded Owl, Trilling Tapaculo & Brown Tinamou.

OCTOBER 07TH

Early breakfast to drive down the road and get some low elevation birds plus try for some target and new birds for the list. We started the day pretty well but later on we got some rain that did not le tus go any further so we decided to move back up the road and get away from the rain, working quite well since we could get some extra birds we were missing. This time we had lunch box by the road and a little break to then continue birding further down since rain stopped, the rest of the afternoon was good since we could get some nice birds and cool pictures from our target birds.

Birds of the Day:

■ The Endemics Inca Flycatcher, Red and White Anpitta & another view of Marcapata Spinetail. Some more birds like Blue Banded Toucannet, Chesnut Bellied Mountain Tanager, Barred Becard, Streaked Tuftedcheek, Fulvous Wren, Gray Browed Brush Finch, Gray Breasted Wood Wren, White Winged Black Tyrant, Strong Billed Woodcreeper, Crimson Mantled Woodpecker, Golden Crowned Flycatcher, Capped Conebill & Chesnut Collared Swift.

Birds we Heard: Chesnut Capped Brush Finch, Andean Solitaire & White Eared Solitaire.

OCTOBER 08TH

This time we walked down the road for some extra birds we were missing, having the chance to get what were looking for. In order to spend more time by the road we brought lunch with us and had it in one of this cool view places along the road. So pretty much the whole day we spent it down the road with good birds and weather.



Birds of the Day:

Golden Headed Quetzal, Handsome Flycatcher, Common Chlorospingus, Greenish Puffleg, Black and Chesnut Eagle, Smoke Colored Pewee, Beryl Spangled Tanager, Saffron Crowned Tanager, Orange Bellied Euphonia, Bronzy Inca, Blue and White Swallow & Rusty Winged Barbtail.

OCTOBER 09TH

Our last walk along the upper part of Manu Road for some target birds with a nice sunny morning and then we came back for lunch, we packed and then we moved to our next Lodge, Cock of the Rock Lodge. On the way to the next place we did some stops for more birds but rain did not let us enjoy the rest of the afternoon so we drove straight to our lodge.

Birds of the Day:

■ The Endemic Parodis Hemispingus, Puna Thisthletail, Rufous Capped Thornbill, Slate Throated Redstart, Plumbeous Pigeon, Montane Foliage Gleaner, Blue Capped Tanager and we heard White Crowned Tapaculo.



OCTOBER 10TH

Early breakfast at Cock of the Rock Lodge, to take advantage of the midday heat but this time did not work because we had a very intense rainy morning, so we did not get as many birds as we supose but we managed to get some cool bird species that filled the rest of the morning until we came back for lunch. After having lunch then we went back up the road for some more birds and we got some uncommon birds.

Birds of the Day:

■ The Rare Buff Tailed Sickelbill, Uniform Antshrike, Paradise Tanager, Streaked Flycatcher, Buff Throated Saltator, Golden Tanager, Blue Gray Tanager, Band Bellied Owl, Green Jay, Spotted Barbtail, Higland Momot, Three Striped Warbler, Yellow Throated Tanager, Black Eared Hemispingus, Speckle Hummingbird, Black Streaked Puffbird, Brown Capped Vireo, Russet Crowned Warbler, Yellow Throated Chlorospingus, Andean Solitaire, Crested Quetzal & Rufous Rumped Foliage Gleaner.

OCTOBER 11TH

We kept our intinerary by walking up early in the morning and continued our routine by going up the road and looked for our target birds along this beautiful Manu Road. The morning was very interesting because we got some nice mix flocks then in the afternoon we had few hours of heavy rain but furtunatelly rain stopped on time and we could bird the rest of the day plus getting a beautiful *Nightjar*.

Birds of the Day:

Slaty Tanager, Olive Striped Flycatcher, Golden Olive Woodpecker, Variable Antshrike, Ochre Faced Tody Flycatcher, Oleaginous Hemispingus, Versicolored Barbet, Spotted Tanager, Lyre Tailed Nightjar, Olivaceous Siskin, Olive Backed Woodcreeper, Golden Collared Honeycreeper, Lemon Browed Flycatcher, Black Billed Treehunter, Yungas Manakin, Hauxwell's Thrush, Streaked Xenop, Squirrel Cuckoo, Chiguanco Thrush & Plumbeous Pigeon.

OCTOBER 12TH

Our morning was good with cool bird flocks and sunny day, so we went up the road again for better bird views and pictures. After this nice morning we headed back for lunch and right after that we went for our experience at the Cock of the Rock Leck, getting some cool pictures plus another good view of *Andean Motmot*. After spending good time with this special birds at the leck, we then moved up the road for more birds but this time rain did not le tus enjoy the rest of the afternoon. So we decided to came back to the lodge since the rain did not stop.

Birds of the Day:

At least 15 nice looking bird, Cock of the Rock at the Leck. Pale Eyed Thrush, Chesnut Collared Swift, Azara's Spinetail, Brown Tinamou, White Backed Fire Eyes.



OCTOBER 13TH

Another nice birding morning with cool birds and very sunny day (hot), so we birded the road around the Lodge getting new species plus some jungle species already since the elevation bring some lowland bird species along this elevation and lodge.

Birds of the Day:

Umbrella Bird right by the nest, Black Goggled Tanager, White Creste Elaenia, Violet Fronted Brilliant, Wedge Billed Hummingbird, Yellow Breasted Antwren, Purple Honeycreeper, Anna's Racketail.

OCTOBER 14TH

This morning was a little rainy and foggy so we could not bird much but we still could managed to get some birds along the road. Later on we went to try for some Owls.

Birds of the Day:

White Winged Tanager, Bluish Fronted Jacamar, Chesnut Breasted Wren, Swallow Tanager, Black Antbird, Fasciated Tiger Heron, Fulvous Breasted Flatbill, Paradise Tanager & Rufescent Screech Owl.

OCTOBER 15TH

One more birding day with good bird life and some relaxing time at the lodge shooting hummingbirds at the feeders.

Birds of the Day:

Good view of Endemic Cerulean Capped Manakin, White Throated Quail Dove, Black Tailed Tityra, Dot Winged Antwren, Ocellated Woodcreper, Golden Bellied Warbler, Brownish Headed Antbird, Ash Browed Spinetail & Chesnut Bellied Seedeater.

OCTOBER 16TH

Our last early birding walk around Cock of the Rock Lodge, getting birds that move around the property and open forest birds along the road (Riparian & Second Growth Forest). So we started by the lodge getting the common birds plus some special ones, then we moved down the road passing by the little town Pillcopata to finally end up to the next lodge and do some owling before dinner.

Birds of the Day:

Rusty Fronted Tody Flycatcher, Solitary Black Cacique, Little Cuckoo, Piratic Flycatcher, Golden Bellied Euphonia, Epaulet Oriole, White Throated Piping Guan, Short Crested Flycatcher, White Winged Becard, Olive Sided Flycatcher, Ornate Antwren, Red Eyed Vireo, Eastern Kingbird, Greater Yellow Headed Vulture, Blue and

Yellow Macaw, Tawny Bellied schree owl, White Lined Antsrike, Pectoral Sparrow, Plain Crowned Spinetail, Lineated Woodpecker, Blue Tailed Emerald, Fork Tailed Woodnymph, White Browed Hermit, White Eyed Parakeet, Great Potoo, Blue Headed Macaw, White Bearded Hermit, Rufous Breasted Hermit, Turquoise Tanager & Gray Breasted Sabrewing.

OCTOBER 17TH

This morning we just walk around the Villa Carmen Lodge's Trails for Bamboo Birds and some others. So our morning walk was nice and got some cool birds plus some mix birds flock. After this beautiful morning we went for lunch and a little siesta since the temperature here can also be hot at midday. Later on we continued with our birding walk.

Birds of the Day:

Plain Brown Woodcreeper, Rufous Breasted Piculet, Yellow Tyrannulet, Lemon Throated Barbet, Fine Barred Piculet, Bluish Slate Antshrike, Yellow Olive Flycatcher, Bamboo Antshrike, Ornate Antwren, Fiery Capped Manakin, Plain Winged Antshrike, Manu Antbird, Pale Tailed Barbthroat, Spangled Cotinga, Sulphur Bellied Flycatcher, Yellow Bellied Tanager, Chesnut Crowned Foliage Gleaner, White Lored Tyrannulet, Rufous Capped Nunlet, Blue black Grossbeak, Hauxwell's Thrush, Yellow Crowned Parrot, Chesnut fronted Macaw, Blue Headed Macaw, Magpie Tanager, Spot Breasted Woodpecker, Zone Tailed Hawk.

Birds we Heard: Cinereous Tinamou, Phaseant Cuckoo, Black Capped Tinamou, Buff Rumped Warbler, Slate Colored Grosbeak, Great Antshrike, Uniform Crake.

OCTOBER 18TH

Being our last full day at Villa Carmen Lodge, we decided to walk the trails again in the morning and late in the afternoon we took a different road looking for the endemic Bird we were missing, fortunatelly we had a great day getting the birds we wanted and getting new spots for the future trips.

Birds of the Day:

■ The Endemic Black Backed Tody Flycatcher, Rufous Headed Woodpecker, Spot Backed Antbird, Buff Throated Woodcreeper, Striated Antbird, Flammulated Pygmy Tyrant, Black Spotted Bare Eye, Buff Rumped Warbler, Pink Throated Becard, Laughing Falcon, Yellow Margined Flycatcher, Chesnut Vented Conebill, Mc Connell's Flycatcher, Chesnut Bellied Seed finch, Spangled Cotinga, Sepia Capped Flycatcher.

Birds we Heard: *Orange Backed Troupial, Chesnut Eared Aracari, Pavonine Cuckoo, Little Tinamou.*

OCTOBER 19TH

We had an early breakfast to then say bye to the lovely people at Villa Carmen Lodge, then heading to Atalaya dock for our 07 hours boat ride. Once on the boat we just started looking for birds as we moved downstream. Along this fantastic boat trip we could get some cool river




birds and also see the different villages along the river plus the different local activities. Arriving in the afternoon gave us time to visit the tree tower for some canopy bird species.

Birds of the Day:

Dusky Chested Flycatcher, Sunbittern, Gray Crowned Flycatcher, Double Thoothed Kite, Emerald (Black Throated) Toucannet, Green Honeycreeper, King Vulture, Blue and Yellow Macaw, Brown Chested Martin, Giant Cowbird, White Banded Swallow, Cocoi Heron, Little Blue Heron, Great Egreat, Blue Crowned (Amazonian) Motmot, Horned Screamer, Large Billed Tern, Yellow Billed Tern & White Chinned Sapphire.

Birds we Heard: Amazonian *Pygmy Owl, Buff Throated Foliage Gleaner, Laurence's Thrush & Broad Billed Motmot.*





OCTOBER 20TH

Our first full day at Manu Wildlife Center, we had some heavy rain in the morning for at least 03 hours and right after that we went out for a walk, getting some cool birds and monkeys. We did not walk to far but we got to see some nice birds. Then had a nice lunch and a good siesta, to then



go back to the trails looking for more birds taking a longer trail for the rest of the afternoon.

Birds of the Day:

■ Pavonine Quetzal, Olive Oropendola, Red Rumped Cacique, Dusky Throated Antshrike, Red Necked Woodpecker, Crested Owl, Peruvian Warbling Antbird, Royal Flycatcher, Blue Crowned Manakin, Ochre Bellied Flycatcher, Epaulet Oriole, White Chinned Woodcreeper, Ruddy Quail Dove, Collared Trogon, White Throated Toucan, Ringed Antpipit, Wedge Billed Woodcreeper, Black Tailed Leaftosser, Band Tailed Manakin, White Flanked Antwren, Slate Colored Hawk, Amazonian Violaceous Trogon &Ruddy Tailed Flycatcher.

Birds we Heard: Striolated Puffbird, Scaly Breasted Wren, Purple Throated Fruitcrow, Dwarf Tyrant Manakin, Channel Billed Toucan.

OCTOBER 21TH

Early breakfast to visit a nice water spot, known as Cocha Blanco, a beautiful lake surounded by magical landscape and many birds. Spending much of the morning sitting and enjoying the morning and birds from a lovely and stable Catamaran. Nice lake for pictures and easy bird spotting area. After this we came back to the Lodge for lunch and have a little siesta to then go for another walk by the many trails around the lodge to look for our target bird (*Trumpeter*).

Birds of the Day:

■ Pale Winged Trumpeter, Pink Throated Becard, Striolated Puffbird, Casqued (Cacique) Oropendola, Buff Throated Woodcreeper, Lesser Kiskidae, Great Kiskidae, Curl Crested Aracari, Anhinga, Green and Rufous Kingfisher, Tui Parakeet, Black Capped Donacobious, Pale Vented Pigeon, White Fronted Nunbird, Yellow Billed Tern, Pale Eyed Blackbird, Black Billed Seed finch, Greater Ani, Snail Kite, Yellow Crowned Parrot, Mealy Parrot, Amazonian Pygmy Owl, Swainson's Thrush, Plain Throated Antwren, White Necked Jacobin & Golden Crowned Spadebill.

Birds we Heard: Great Jacamar, Hauxwell's Thrush, Channel Billed Toucan, Varzea Schiffornis, Rufous Sided Crake, Olivaceous Woodcreeper & White Bellied Tody Tyrant.

OCTOBER 22TH

Our last Birding Day at this Lodge we spent it by the Antthrush Trail (Gadua Bamboo) for some bamboo specialist and after this we took a short trail by the Lodge getting some good birds before lunch. Later on we had a big rain but at least let us go out for a short visit to the Tree Tower, getting some cool birds up there.

Birds of the Day:

● Gray Headed Kite, White Browed Antbird, Cobalt Winged Parakeet, Lineated (Inambari) Woodcreeper, Red Rumped Cacique, Rose Fronted Parakeet, Great Antshrike, Blackish (Riparian) Antbird, White Winged Shrike Tanager, Wing Barred Piprites, Elegant Woodcreeper, Collared Plover & Crimson Crested Woodpecker.

Birds we Heard: *Cream Coloured Woodpecker, Laurence's Thrush, Yellow Margine Flycatcher & Pygmy Antwren.*

OCTOBER 23TH

Very early departure to be on time on our almost last adventure Birding Trip. So we took the boat at 4:30 am for 02 hours downstream and got to Colorado Village, where we took a taxi car for 01 hour and then a short boat ride to go acroos the Inambari River and finally take the 02 and half hours car ride to Puerto Maldonado. So the trip to the next Lodge did not end there since we had to take another car and boat to go for another extra 03 hours to finally arrive to our target Lodge. Once at the lodge we just decided to relax the rest of the day since we had to get up early the following morning. Our birding was mainly from the boat.

Birds of the Day:

A very nice family of Orinoco Goose, Great Black Hawk, Black Skimmer, Sand Coloured Nighthawk, Pied Ladwing, Southern Rough Winged Swallow, Moscovy Duck & Southern Caracara.



OCTOBER 24TH

Another early start to visit the Biggest Macaw's Clay Lick along Tambopata River and our boat ride to the place was a little wet since we got some rain along this trip, pretty much the whole way from the lodge to the Macaw's place. So once at the point we had to wait for at least one hour then the weather started getting better and we could finally reach our target destination. So lucky this day since rain really stopped and we could get the natural show we were looking for. Numbers of colorful birds flying around that le tus enjoy the place very well and get some nice shots. After nice lunch we had a requeried siesta to then go and see the Harpy Eagle Nest, we got to see the 08 month old Chick playing around the nest and we waited for the Mother but did not come out.

Birds of the Day:

Scarlet Macaw, Red and Green Macaw, Blue and Yellow Macaw, Blue Headed Parrot, Orange Cheecked Parrot, Cobalt Winged Parakeet, Blue Crowned (Amazonian) Trogon, Green and Gold Tanager Birds we Heard, Gray Antbird, Pavonine Quetzal, Little Tinamou, Olive Backed Foliage Gleaner & Plain Browned Woodcreeper.

OCTOBER 25TH

Our last birding morning around this beautiful Lodge, so we decided to do a short walk by the many trail around the lodge getting some cool birds and Monkeys right by the main path. After some bird spotting and shooting we came back for breakfast to then start moving back to Puerto Maldonado for the last two days.

Birds of the Day:

White Bellied Parrot, Opal Rumped Tanager, Paradise Jacamar, Grayish Mourner, White Throated Antbird, rufous tailed Foliage Gleaner.

OCTOBER 26TH

Once at Puerto Maldonado we went out to get some target birds that move in this corner, since temperature here can be really hot, my guests did not want to spend much time on the field and finally we had a soft day doing some few hours in the morning and a bit in the afternoon.



Later on and being our last night together we went to visited a nice restaurant and celebrate our Birding time together.

Birds of the Day:

White Throated Jacamar, Brazilian Teal, Straight Billed Woodcreeper, Barred Antshrike, Double Coloured Seedeater, Line Seedeater, Striped Cuckoo, Little Woodpecker, Saffron Finch & House Sparrow.

OCTOBER 27TH
