MARCH 31ST, LIMA ARRIVAL – PUCUSANA

I personally went to the airport to wait for my guest, this time a friendly family from England. We then drove to our Hotel in Miraflores, a nice place in Lima Downtown. We also went for a nice lunch and talked a bit of the detail for the following days to then go and visit the first birding place called Pucusana Fishing Port. This first place is located at 01 hour south of Lima where we had a nice boat ride to move around some rocky islands and enjoy the first sea birds and animals.

BIRDS OF THE DAY:

The endemic Sea Sided Cinclodes and some others like Humbolt Penguin, Guanay Cormorant, Red Legged Cormorant, Blackish Oystercatcher, Blue Footed Booby, Gray Gull, Royal Tern, Peruvian Pelican, Inca Tern, Peruvian Booby, Belchers Gull, Kelp Gull, Turkey Vulture, Ruddy Turnstone.

APRIL 01ST, LIMA - SANTA EULALIA CANYON

outh Birding A very nice full day to the closest Andean Bird diversity from Lima City. At only 03 hours from Lima, you can have a great endemic bird list with extra species from the west slope, this place also gives you Birding very nice scenery and good chances for animals as you drive down the canyon. We were lucky to find a very cool family of Andean Condor, 06 of them flying together, giving us very good views and the chance to photograph them. We started early that day in order to get the target birds and being able to make the loop that is required to see the birds you want.

BIRDS OF THE DAY:

Endemic birds like White bellied Cinclodes, Dark Winged Miner, Great Inca Finch, Rusty Bellied Brush Finch, Black Metaltail, Black Necked Woodpecker, Rusty Crowned Tit Spinetail & Thick Billed Miner. Some others like Black Siskin, Hooded Siskin, Ash breasted Sierra Finch, Plumbeous Sierra Finch, Giant Coot, Andean Condor, White Winged Diuca Finch, White Browed Ground Tyrant, Slender Billed Miner, Andean Goose, Mountain Caracara, Peruvian Pygmy Owl, Collared Warbling Finch, Yellow Billed Tit Tyrant, White Winged Cinclodes, Creamy Winged Cinclodes, Andean Flicker, Yellow Billed Teal, Crested Duck, Black Winged Ground Dove, Purple Collared Woodstart, Peruvian Sheartail, Scrub Blackbird, Oasis Hummingbird, Golden Grosbeak, Bare Faced Ground Dove, Streak Throated Canastero, Chiquanco Thrush, Spot Winged Pigeon, White Tipped Dove, Andean Swift, Rufous Webbed Bush Tyrant, Black Billed Shrike Tyrant, Andean Hillstart.

APRIL 02ND, LIMA – CUSCO CITY

We left the Hotel early today to start with the Southern Andes and Machupicchu. After almost 02-hour flight from Lima to Cusco, we then went for a nice Lunch and special City Tour around the main archeological sites. We had a great local guide who was able to give us



a very good Incas culture lecture. During the Cultural tour, we also had the chance to do some shopping while visiting the local markets. And right after that, we went to a lovely restaurant to try the Alpaca and other local Andean food.

APRIL 3RD, HUACARPAY - COTINGA CAMP - URUBAMBA CITY

We started with a nice Marsh and lake area for two specific birds, we first visited Huacarpay Lake, where we could see some birds we were missing in previous bird habitat. We also visited a new nice bird place known as Cotinga Camp, where we could get some more extra bird species and the uncommon Sword-Billed Hummingbird.



BIRDS OF THE DAY:

The endemics Bearded Mountaineer, Rusty Fronted Canastero & Creamy Crested Spinetail. Some others like Tyrian Metaltail, Rust and Yellow Tanager, Puna Teal, Yellow Billed Pintail, Plumbeous Rail, Greater Yellowleg, Andean Gull, Cinereous Harrier, Many Colored Rush Tyrant, Wren Like Rushbird, Band Tailed Seedeater, Black Thorated Flowerpiercer, White Crested Elaenia, White Browed Chat Tyrant.

APRIL 04TH, URUBAMBA – AGUAS CALIENTES

Relaxing day since I let the family rest more than usual and starting our way to Machupicchu at midday. Nice train for 02 hours along the Urubamba River and get to a very nice hotel at Aguas Calientes where we had a nice view of female Andean Cock of the Rock, right by the garden. Then the rest of our afternoon, we walk along the railroad to see some more birds and get ready for the following day.

APRIL 05TH, MACHUPICCHU – URUBAMBA

We had a nice breakfast to then take the bus for 15 minutes and see one of the World Seven Wonders, Machupicchu. Our local guide gave a very nice combination of Culture and local Incas life, after enjoying this beautiful place we slowly walk down to continue our birding day. On the way down, we could see some cool birds as we enjoyed the scenery, finally back at the hotel for a great lunch and then take the train back to Urubamba where we spent the night.

APRIL 06TH, URUBAMBA - COCK OF THE ROCK LODGE - MANU ROAD

We left the Hotel at Urubamba (Cusco), early in the morning to continue with Cloud Forest along the famous Birding Road, Manu. A little cloudy day in the beginning but then little by little we got a better light, on the way we had some main stops like Nimamarka Area, a place with an interesting building like Tomb structures, nice place to stretch the legs out and learn about Inkas Culture. Right after that, we had another stop along the road and this time was at Paucartambo Town, nice Colonial Town with cool building around and people and this time the reason for our stop was Lunch. Finally, we reach the main road with all the bird variety we were looking for to then reach the Lodge.

APRIL 07TH, FULL DAY COCK OF THE ROCK LODGE

Another great day since we could see more than 06 Andean Cock of the Rocks displaying and letting us get some nice shots. We also got to see a nice troop of monkeys by the Kitchen and along the road, nice sunny day with many butterflies along the road. Right after good birding day, we were lucky enough to see a Screech Owl right by the lodge.

APRIL 08TH, COCK OF THE ROCK LODGE – ATALAYA – MANU BIRDING LODGE

Another great day since we found some very uncommon bird species around the lodge before leaving. We went for a short walk by the property and took the car to go for our boat ride along the majestic Madre De Dios River, some cool bird along the river plus a nice family of Capibaras known to be the largest rodent on earth. Finally, after 05 hours traveling this magical river, we arrive at Manu Lodge where we spent our first proper jungle night.

APRIL 09TH, MANU BIRDING LODGE TRAILS & MACAWS CLAY LICK

We had a very nice day visiting a cool place with many Macaws, Parrots, and Parakeets flying around. We could also see some extra birds while waiting for the Macaws activity, 40 minutes boat from the lodge to this special area and some time spent at the blind while enjoying a nice breakfast. Later in the afternoon, we went for a bird walk to get some more birds from Terra Firme and Varzea forest, cool walk to add new birds to our list.

APRIL 10TH, MANU BIRDING LODGE & BLANCO LAKE


